The Global Impact Co-Chairperson, Soror Phyllis L. Tyler has been collaborating with Basileus Bertina Power- Stewart, Program Director Soror Elaine Singh along with Soror Renee Diallo, chairperson of the Quilting Scrapbook Club and Soror Ebony Barney in order to begin implementation of the International Program Committees “Little Dresses for Africa” Project. We will elicit the support of other Target Chairpersons as well as Chapter Sorors, and Community Partners in order to meet our goal of 500 dresses. These dresses will be delivered to Boule held in Atlanta, Georgia in July 2016. We have designated days for our Sisterly Sewing Circles, which are April 16th and 23rd and May 7th, 14th, and 28th. May 28th will be designated as “Dress Completion Day”, which will be the final day for sewing and creating the garments. All dresses must be turned in on May 28th, where they will be packed and prepared for transport to Atlanta. Our vision is that Sorors can make dresses during their scheduled committee meetings if they desire to do so, or they may join us on the designated Sisterly Sewing Circle Days. If Sorors do not wish to participate in the sewing of the garments we are requesting that they donate \$20.00 minimum, which will cover the cost of two yards of fabric and trimming for one dress. Additionally we will solicit corporate donations or grants that might be used to offset some of the cost of the dresses. We have Sorors who are professional seamstresses and quilt makers and their skills and expertise are being requested to support others who are at various skill levels in their sewing. A schedule has been created and designated areas at the Akarama Community Center will be used as workspaces.

For those Sorors who wish to, they can complete their dresses at their homes or a place of their choosing.

Next Steps:

Sign up seamstresses at next chapter meeting and encourage all members to participate in the project at some level.

Each Soror should make a \$20.00 contribution or a fabric donation.

Guidelines:

1. Fabric is preferably cotton or cotton blend (including solids and prints)
2. Pre-wash materials (warm water without fabric softener or detergent)
3. Fabric may consist of new fabric or pillow cases
4. Please no small attachments including buttons, zippers, or small objects that can be swallowed.
